PROPOSED CHANGE TO NUGC CONSTITUTION CURRENT WORDING

- 19.1 The Procedure shall be as recommended by EG. Should there be such an incident, the County Secretary shall immediately notify EG and also the Insurance Company if necessary. The Disciplinary Committee shall consist of the President and four individual members from affiliated clubs nominated by the Council.
- 7.3 The Council shall from time to time nominate for approval by the Executive Committee such number of Vice Presidents as shall be necessary to maintain their number at five. In addition, The Council may nominate for approval by the Executive Committee a retiring Vice-President for the title of Lifetime Vice President.

PROPOSED WORDING

- 19.1 The Procedure shall be as recommended by EG and set out in the NUGC Disciplinary Policy. Should there be such an incident, the County Secretary shall immediately notify EG and also the Insurance Company if necessary. The Disciplinary Committee shall consist of THREE individual members from affiliated clubs nominated by the Council.
- 7.3 The Council shall from time to time nominate for approval by the Executive Committee such number of Vice Presidents as shall be necessary to maintain their number at five. In addition, The Council may nominate for approval by the Executive Committee a retiring Vice-President or others for the title of Lifetime Vice President.
